

## **Instructions for authors of the journal *Lymphologie in Forschung und Praxis***

*Lymphologie in Forschung und Praxis* publishes original scientific studies, reviews and case reports on the subject of Lymphology. By submitting the manuscript, the author ensures that neither the text nor the used illustrations collide with third party rights. The text should not be offered to another journal and has to be unpublished. The text has to be ready for printing. It should not exceed 25.000 characters (incl. blanks). More than 30 references should not be published. After publication, the author will receive two copies of the journal. The articles are published in the journal *Lymphologie in Forschung und Praxis* and on the websites of Deutsche Gesellschaft für Lymphologie e.V. and Gesellschaft Deutschsprachiger Lymphologen e.V.

### **Outline of the article**

The article should be structured in: 1. title (short, maybe with subtitle), author's name and institution, 2. summary and 3-4 keywords, 3. introduction, 4. material and methods, 5. results, 6. discussion, 7. references, 8. captions, 9. tables.

### **Submission form**

The text should be saved in one of the following formats: Rich Text (.rtf) or Word for Windows (.doc). Please do not include manual line breaks apart from the one at the end of each paragraph. For emphases in the text an universal form (in italics or fat (no capital letters)) should be chosen.

### **Figures, diagrams and tables**

Figures should be submitted in reproducible form. They should be saved in the formats .eps or .tif or .jpg (resolution 360 dpi with issue size 12 cm). Each picture has to be placed on a separate sheet. Please do not incorporate the figures in a WORD- or a POWER-POINT-document! Tables and diagrams should not be placed in the text, but on separate numbered sheets. All diagrams and tables should be sent as open files which can be still worked on (.xls, .ppt). More than six figures per article should not be published.

### **Reference List**

References are listed in the order in which they are mentioned in the text. They are cited in the text by inserting the appropriate number in square brackets. Please use "et al." after the sixth author. Examples:

Journal: Straub H: Letale Komplikation der Fibrinolyse. Mü med Wschr 1982;124:17-19.

Book: Pillsbury DM: In: Muller H (ed). A manual of dermatology. WB Saunders and Company, Philadelphia 1971;173-175.

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### **Protection of Privacy**

The author is responsible for the anonymisation of all patient data. He needs the patient's written permission if patients' photos are used for the article.

### **Acceptance for publication**

It must be guaranteed, that a permission for publication is given by all authors involved and also the institute executive committee. The editorial committee decides whether the manuscript will be accepted for publication.

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The author receives a notice of arrival from the editorial committee and correction proposals of the anonymous reviewers if necessary and afterwards the acceptance for printing. If required the editorial committee will make editorial changes.
